3. Finalization of agreement and Bylaws for 2022-2023 signed off for the year.
4. SAC Funds for 2022-2023 School Year: Emailed proposal for new sound system from Long and McQuade - Approved - Update - Cost was $\$ 5456.77$. Installation is complete and was ready for Holiday concert in December.

New Business:
5. Proposal for Bell Schedule Changes for 2023-24 School Year

6. Principal Report:
7. Student Success Planning
a. System Wide Goal: All students in HRCE will be reading at grade level by the end of grade 2. Chebucto Heights will continue modified goal - all students will be reading at grade level.
b. Literacy Goal: Students, using the reciprocal relationship between reading and writing, will demonstrate improvement in the areas of critical thinking, organization, and language use.
c. Mathematics Goal: Students will demonstrate improvement in number sense with a focus on partitioning and representing numbers.
i. Three Strategies for this past month:
ii. High Quality Classroom Instruction - Professional development session with teachers on Phonemic Awareness (Anchor Text - Word Study and Phonics by Jan Richardson) and HRCE Phonological Awareness Continuum for December $2^{\text {nd }}$ PD Session coming.
iii. Monday Memo including series of PD videos for teachers on mental math strategies that can be incorporated daily.
iv. PD with Principals to provide to teachers on Time to Learn and maximizing time during the school day.

## d. Teacher collaborative -

i. All teachers had 90-120 mins in October to work collaboratively during the instructional day. We used school-based fund to achieve this.

i. As of the end of December we will have three data sets for literacy on every student, ALL students are moving forward.

9. Overall Trends in literacy data
a. FI students are doing better than ENG student
b. A lot of students are already at the end of term benchmark

## 9. November Data (End of Term one)

a. Primary $-100 \%$ of students are either Meeting or Approaching
b. Grade $1-57 \%$ are either meeting or approaching, 43\% developing
c. Grade $2-55 \%$ are either meeting or approaching, 45\% Developing
d. Grade 3-59\% are either meeting or approaching, 41\% Developing
e. Grade 4-35\% either meeting or approaching, 65\% developing
f. Grade $5-56 \%$ either meeting or approaching, 44\% developing

## ii. Action Steps

1. Grade 4 Literacy Blitz - mixed results, was implemented as best we could but was impacted due to teacher shortages, with that said, all students showed improved so we determined it was successful.
2. Phonological awareness PD will support our students who are developing at all grade levels
3. Lunch and Learn PD Sessions with Literacy Coaches - first session was on getting students out of pattern text.

g. Data entry system is ready for input for term 2. We will have report in April meeting.
h. Fact Fluency Work with Grade 4 and 5 students
i. We are continuing with our strategies for instruction (3-part lesson plan), collaboration (PLC work), and moving into common assessment practices.
j. We are also doing a questionnaire for teachers to get feedback to inform upcoming lunch and learn sessions for staff.
