School Start Up

Student Success Planning

- System Wide Goal: All students in HRCE will be reading at grade level by the end of grade 2. Chebucto Heights will continue modified goal – all students will be reading at grade level.
- Literacy Goal: Students, using the reciprocal relationship between reading and writing, will demonstrate improvement in the areas of critical thinking, organization, and language use.
- Mathematics Goal: Students will demonstrate improvement in number sense with a focus on partitioning and representing numbers.

Three Strategies for each:

- High quality classroom instruction with a focus on small group instruction
- Assessment practices using learning targets and performance indicators to monitor learning
- Teacher collaborative working within teacher teams to create intervention model to support student learning. This is most difficult strategy under certain public health restrictions.
- Fall Data collection with reading has started last month. We will have two data sets prior to October 25th.

- School data wall moved to staff room and HRCE has modified input site to support teachers. There is now a section on next steps.
- CLT Days for all teachers to work with October Literacy Data
- Reading scores in September indicated a slide in some students from June. This
 was something we expected. October data will give us a better indication of
 where students are.
 - Action Steps
 - Relocation of Tier One Support School Wide (Resource, literacy Support, Math Support Teacher) to maximize impact –We have redesigned our Teaching and Learning Support Teams to streamline support for teachers.
 - More emphasis on classroom reading (books in hands)
 - Jumping more quickly this year out of pattern texts
 - Home reading program for every student
